



Groundbreaking for New Headquarters and Warehouse Facility

The Green Valley Special Utility District (GVSUD) officially broke ground at the construction site of its new, multi-million dollar headquarters building and warehouse facility on November 9. The facility will be built on a 35-acre site at 605 S. Center Street (FM 465) and marks the first new facility the Company has built during its 58-year history.

Kathleen Jackson, Board Member of the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB), which provided funding for the facility, was on hand to speak and join in the festivities. "It is a real credit to Green Valley in that you are looking forward to the future; you are providing for not only the needs for today but also thinking about future needs. It is also vital that you are engaged in wastewater treatment because, theoretically, we know that there is not one more molecule of water in the world today than when God created the earth. It is incumbent on each of us to be good stewards of that water so that we can treat it, return it, and use it again."
